



SLIC @Langafel Admissions arrangements

SLIC@Langafel is a designated provision for pupils with a primary need of Autism who are of Primary school age.

Eligibility criteria

- A child whose primary need is detailed as ASD and where other difficulties encountered are associated with autism.
- The child must have an Education Health and Care Plan / Statement where the primary need is stated to be ASD.
- A child who does not have emotional and behavioural difficulties as a prime concern.
- A child whose parents are in full agreement with resource provision placement and are aware that their child is also part of the attached mainstream school.
- A child who would be able to, or be judged to have the potential to attend some aspects of mainstream provision. This may be for example academic lessons or PE, assembly.
- A child's placement is an efficient use of resources, for example pupils who require one to one support to access heavily differentiated work would be considered an inappropriate use of resources.
- The child's placement in the school is not incompatible with the efficient education of the other children with whom the child would be educated

Admissions Process

- Parents visit the school to view.
- Parents make their preference known to the local authority.
- Local authority sends papers to school.
- Teacher-in-Charge (TiC) of Provision reads papers and in most cases will arrange to observe the child in their current placement.
- TiC informs local authority of Provisions ability to meet he needs of the child / the child's suitability for placement in the Provision.
- Local authority makes the decision as to whether to offer the child a place in the Provision.
- Should a place be offered the TiC will communicate with parents to make transition arrangements.

Funding

SLIC@Langafel has 17 places commissioned by the Local Authority.
